## **Goat Duty Checklist**

AM (arrive no later than 9am):	
	Clean all 3 pens – make sure to clean under pallets
	Feed grain according to the feeding chart
	Give 4 flakes of hay – 2 in the hay bag and 2 more in the hay feeder
	<ul> <li>If they will be out in the pasture, you will need to put hay in the feeder along the fence</li> <li>If they have leftover hay, please use your discretion as to what they need more of while ensuring they have hay in each pen. Please don't continue to pile additional hay on top of old hay as this promotes waste. Try to place the old hay on top so they will finish this first.</li> </ul>
	Refill all water buckets (you may need to dump them first if they are dirty or have poop in them)
	<ul> <li>The large water buckets are plain water OR water with electrolytes</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>The red &amp; pink water buckets get 3 capfuls of apple cider vinegar added to them (fill bucket all the way full)</li> </ul>
	Rinse all feed buckets with the hose and hang sideways to dry
	Ensure that all feed is closed, tack area gate is locked and goat pens/gates are secure.
	Send GROUPME message notifying that the goats were fed & pens cleaned (pictures encouraged)
PΝ	1 ( <b>arrive</b> between 4:30-7pm):
	All of the above as well as
	Remove any hay and poop in the paddocks (fenced dirt areas outside pens)
	Put any remaining hay from the hay feeder into the hay bags and clean out the hay feeder along with the bottom tray (hay and poop should be dumped so this stays clean).
	Check baking soda and minerals (should be clean and dry). Clean them out (if needed). When putting new baking soda and minerals, please only give 2 scoops of each to avoid waste.
